INTRODUCTION

1. Further to the decision of the Council at its 136th Session (June 2009) that a Summit on Food Security be held in November 2009, invitations were extended to all Members to attend the *World Summit on Food Security* from Monday 16 to Wednesday 18 November 2009. As a consequence of this decision the time frame originally foreseen for the Thirtysixth session of the Conference was subsequently adjusted so that the session open immediately after the Summit on the afternoon of Wednesday 18 November and close on Monday 23 November¹. This change in dates was communicated to the membership by circular letter ref. C36 of 30 July 2009.

AGENDA AND SCHEDULING OF ITEMS

2. A provisional agenda for the Conference is found in <u>Appendix A</u>.

3. Two Commissions will be established: <u>Commission I</u> (substantive and policy matters in food and agriculture) and <u>Commission II</u> (programme and budgetary matters).

4. Action 2.5 of the Immediate Plan of Action regarding the Conference which provides that: "each session of the Conference will usually have one major theme agreed by the Conference, normally on the recommendation of Council." The Council at its 136th Session (June 2009) proposed that the main focus for the General Debate to be held under item 5 *Review of the State of Food and Agriculture* be based on Strategic Objective I: *Improving Preparedness for, and Effective Response to, Food and Agricultural Threats and Emergencies.*

COMPOSITION OF DELEGATIONS

5. Delegations are normally headed by Ministers. In deciding the composition of their delegations, Members are invited to bear in mind the need for effective participation in the work of the Commissions as well as in Plenary.

6. In accordance with Article III of the Constitution, each Member of the Organization may be represented by one delegate, who may be accompanied by alternates, associates and advisers (see <u>Appendix B</u>).

CONSTITUTIONAL DUTIES OF THE CONFERENCE

7. In addition to adopting amendments to the Constitution, Rules and Regulations of the Organization, and approving conventions and agreements, the Conference has the following specific constitutional duties:

Admission of New Members

8. The Conference, as the supreme authority of the Organization, admits new Members and deals with all matters relating to membership. At the date of preparing this document no applications for membership had been received. Under Rule XIX-2 of the General Rules of the Organization (GRO) applications are receivable up to 30 days before the opening of the Conference Session, i.e. Monday, 19 October 2009. The admission of new Members is carried out by secret ballot and requires a two-thirds majority of the votes cast, provided that the total number of affirmative and negative votes cast shall be more than one half of the Member Nations of the

Organization. Membership becomes effective on the date on which the Conference approves the application.

Appointment of the Independent Chairperson of the Council

9. In accordance with Article V-2 of the Constitution and Rule XXIII-I GRO, the Conference appoints the Independent Chairperson of the Council.

10. Rule XXIII-I(b) GRO provides that the Council determine the closing date for submission of nominations for the Office of Independent Chairperson of the Council by Member Nations to the Secretary-General of the Conference. Likewise, the Council also sets the date by which the Secretary-General circulates these nominations to all Members of the Organization. The 136th Session of Council (June 2009) set 12.00 hours on Monday 7 September 2009 as the closing date for submission of nominations for this appointment, and Monday 14 September 2009 as the date by which such nominations are circulated by letter and through the Permanent Representatives Web site by the Secretary-General.

Election of Council Members

11. In accordance with Article V-l of the Constitution, the Conference elects the Members of the Council. Conference document C 2009/11 contains information on the election of Council Members, including Nomination Forms.

OFFICERS OF THE CONFERENCE

12. In accordance with Rule XXIV-5(b) GRO, the Council, at its 136th Session (June 2009), was called upon to propose countries to nominate candidates for the offices of Chairperson of the Conference and Chairpersons of the Commissions of the Conference. At its 137th Session (28 September-2 October 2009), the Council will nominate the Chairperson of the Conference and the Chairpersons of the Commissions, which in turn will be approved by the Thirty-sixth Session of the Conference. Nominations for the Vice-Chairpersons of Commission I and Commission II will be approved by the Conference through the General Committee. The 137th Session of the Conference; (ii) the seven elected Members of the General Committee to the Conference; and (iii) nine Members of the Credentials Committee. Following past practice the members of the Credentials Committee so nominated will commence their work in the 15 days leading up to the Conference.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

13. The 136th Session of the Council also recommended the establishment of a Conference Resolutions Committee composed of seven members, one from each FAO region.

14. The 136th Session of the Council also reiterated the view, expressed on previous occasions, that resolutions should be kept to a minimum, and be confined to matters requiring a formal decision by Conference. <u>Appendix C</u> sets out the criteria for Conference resolutions and the functions and operating procedures of the Resolutions Committee.

INVITATIONS

15. The United Nations, its Specialized Agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency are entitled to be represented at sessions of the Conference, without the right to vote. Other intergovernmental organizations having concluded an agreement with FAO which contains specific provisions to this effect have a right to attend as observers. Those non-governmental organizations which have consultative status are also entitled to send observers to Conference sessions. 16. Other intergovernmental organizations as well as non-governmental organizations having specialized consultative status or liaison status may be invited on a provisional basis by the Director-General, subject to Conference approval. Accordingly, the Provisional Agenda of the Session contains an item entitled "Admission of Observers".

17. The above provisions are set out in Rule XVII GRO and also in the "FAO Policy Concerning Relations with International Non-Governmental Organizations" (FAO Basic Texts, Volume II, Section P).

18. Observers from non-governmental organizations will be invited to attend informal meetings during the Conference.

19. The 136th Session of the Council noted the Director-General's suggestion that Palestine be invited to attend the 36th Session of the Conference in an observer capacity.

SUMMARY

20. The 136th Session of the Council <u>recommended</u> that:

- 1. Two Commissions be established to examine respectively Substantive and Policy Matters in Food and Agriculture (Commission I) and Programme and Budgetary Matters (Commission II);
- 2. A Conference Resolution Committee composed of seven members, one from each region, be established;
- 3. Palestine be invited to the Conference;
- 4. The statements of Heads of Delegation be limited to a maximum of 5 minutes each.

APPENDIX B EXTRACT FROM ARTICLE III OF THE CONSTITUTION OF FAO

THE CONFERENCE (provisions regulating composition of delegations)

1. There shall be a Conference of the Organization in which each Member Nation and Associate Member shall be represented by one delegate. Associate Members shall have the right to participate in the deliberations of the Conference but shall not hold office nor have the right to vote.

2. Each Member Nation and Associate Member may appoint alternates, associates and advisers to its delegate. The Conference may determine the conditions for the participation of alternates, associates and advisers in its proceedings, but any such participation shall be without the right to vote, except in the case of an alternate, associate, or adviser participating in the place of a delegate.

3. No delegate may represent more than one Member Nation or Associate Member.

4. Each Member Nation shall have only one vote. A Member Nation which is in arrears in the payment of its financial contributions to the Organization shall have no vote in the Conference if the amount of its arrears equals or exceeds the amount of the contributions due from it for the two preceding calendar years. The Conference may, nevertheless, permit such a Member Nation to vote if it is satisfied that the failure to pay is due to conditions beyond the control of the Member Nation.

APPENDIX C CRITERIA FOR CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS, FUNCTIONS AND OPERATING PROCEDURES OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

1. <u>Criteria for the Formulation of Resolutions</u>

Resolutions should be confined essentially to the following normal matters:

- a) Amendments to the Constitution, the General Rules of the Organization, and the Financial Regulations.
- b) Approval or confirmation of conventions or agreements and of amendments thereto.
- c) Establishment of bodies under Article VI of the Constitution and adoption or amendment of the Statutes of such Bodies.
- d) Adoption of the Programme of Work and Budget for the ensuing biennium.
- e) Decisions regarding financial matters such as the Working Capital Fund, the scale of contributions, and adoption of audited accounts.
- f) Major programme and policy matters,
- g) Recommendations to Members or to international organizations.
- h) Matters relating to the appointment of the Director-General and the Independent Chairperson of the Council.
- i) Tributes and commemorations of special importance to FAO.

2. <u>Functions of the Resolutions Committee</u>

- a) The Resolutions Committee shall examine all draft resolutions, with the exception of those submitted to the Conference by the Council, unless determined otherwise by the General Committee.
- b) The Resolutions Committee shall endeavour to keep the number of resolutions to a minimum, and to ensure that resolutions conform to the criteria set forth above. It shall also draw attention to any significant constitutional, programme or budgetary implications of draft resolutions proposed for adoption.
- c) The Resolutions Committee may make editorial or similar amendments not affecting the substance of draft resolutions. The Committee may recommend such other amendments as it may deem appropriate. With the consent of the sponsors, the Committee may amend draft resolutions moved from the floor in the course of the Conference session.

3. <u>Operating Procedures of the Resolutions Committee</u>

- a) Meetings of the Resolutions Committee shall be convened, as often as necessary, by its Chairperson or by the General Committee. Except as provided in paragraph (e) below, meetings of the Committee shall be held in private. The Committee shall maintain close liaison with the General Committee on both substantive and procedural matters.
- b) Draft resolutions shall be transmitted to the Resolutions Committee before they are submitted to a Commission or a Plenary meeting of the Conference for discussion and approval.

- c) If a draft resolution does not meet the criteria set forth above, the Resolutions Committee will suggest that the substance be incorporated into the narrative text of the Conference Report.
- d) If the Resolutions Committee has doubts regarding the likelihood of agreement in the substance of a draft resolution, the Committee may decide that the substance be debated in the appropriate forum, and that after this debate and a decision on the substance, the draft resolution be returned to the Resolutions Committee for consideration.
- e) The Resolutions Committee may invite the sponsors of a draft resolution to participate in its deliberations and, subject to the consent of such sponsors, may make such amendments to draft resolutions as it may consider appropriate.
- f) The Resolutions Committee may delegate its Chairperson or one or more of its members to attend the debate where a draft resolution is discussed, either to explain the Committee's views and reasons for any proposed changes, or to follow the debate so as to be able to inform the Committee of the background when the text of the draft resolution is submitted to the Committee.
- g) The Resolutions Committee shall submit reports on all draft resolutions which have been referred to it, and such reports shall be circulated as Conference documents. Amendments to draft resolutions recommended by the Committee in its reports shall be deemed to be amendments within the meaning of Rule XI-3 GRO and, if necessary, shall be considered by the appropriate Commission or at a Plenary meeting on the day on which the relevant report is circulated.
